Georgia State University will host the first Atlanta Latino Project Forum on April 15, bringing together nongovernmental organizations, media, and university faculty involved with research, education and service initiatives in the Latino communities.

“The Atlanta Latino Forum: Bridging Communities through Dialogue” will be held in the Department of Communication suite, One Park Place South, sixth floor.

Group discussions and a keynote speaker will focus on specific issues, followed by luncheon.

The Project is headed by the University’s Center for International Media Education (CIME) and its Center for Latin American and Latino Studies (CLALS), the Department of Anthropology, and faculty from several other Georgia State University departments, institutes, and offices.
